Dear Surgical Guest,

Welcome to Boulder Surgery Center. Please read the following for important information regarding your surgical procedure.

- Registration personnel from Boulder Surgery Center will call to obtain your demographic and insurance information. You may call directly at (303)938-5470 if that is more convenient.
- As soon as your surgery is scheduled, please follow the instructions provided to
 access the on-line patient registration to complete your medical history. You will need a
 list of your current medications available for this process. Once you have completed
 the on-line medical history form, one of our nurses will contact you for any follow-up
 and to provide information to you regarding your surgery.
- Based on your medications and history, diagnostic lab tests, X-rays and EKGs may need
 to be completed prior to your surgery. These are not routinely performed on all
 surgical patients. After a review of your medical history by the nurse, you will be
 contacted with instructions regarding completing any identified tests.
- You will be going home the same day. It is **required** that someone else drive you. If
 you are using public transportation to return home, you **must** have a responsible adult
 to escort you home. It is **strongly suggested** that someone stay with you until the
 following day.
- Call your surgeon's office if you develop a cold, sore throat, fever or any other illness that occurs within 48 hours of your surgery.

DIETARY RESCTRICTIONS:

Do not eat or drink anything after midnight the night before your surgery, unless the Pre-Op Nurse has provided special eating or drinking instructions. This includes no gum, hard candy, cough drops, coffee, tea or water. This is very important for your safety. If you do not follow these instructions, your procedure may be cancelled or delayed.

WHAT TO BRING:

J Bring the Boulder Surgery Center packet.
Bring your insurance card, a photo ID, and payment (if applicable)
Please do NOT wear makeup, deodorant, creams or lotions.
Bring a case for contacts, glasses and dentures.
Bring crutches if having knee or foot surgery – to check for proper fit and receive
instructions for use
Bring any icing devices, slings, braces that have been provided to you for surgery.
Leave ALL jewelry and valuables at home. BSC is not responsible for valuables.
Wear loose fitting comfortable clothes.



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DIRECTIONS TO THE BOULDER SURGERY CENTER:

- Our address is 1136 Alpine Avenue Suite 115 (**first floor, Brenton Building**). However, the main entrance and reception area are located on the south side of the building, facing **North Street.**
- From Broadway, turn west on North Street and drive about 300 feet.
- Turn right at the second driveway and drive forward to the passenger loading zone in front of the Brenton Building. We are on the first floor.
